<u>April Demonstrator – Michael Roberts</u>

Michael Roberts will be returning April 20, for the second installment of his Cork Bark Elm development series. Below is a photo of one of the Elms he boxed at home, which is just beginning to push its new spring growth (on far right). The photo on the middle is the same tree in January after trimming. The first photo is the tree immediately after it was put in the wood box. Mike will review the progress of all three trees (including the raffle tree from the January demo which is the tree won by Mitch Fennel) and discuss and trim the branches and new leaders for the spring and summer growth. Don't miss this important step in the development of these trees.

Just after putting in box, and on right after trimming. This is the tree that Mitch won.





At the April meeting, Mitch will return with the tree he won at the raffle (tree #1) and club members will decide which of the two remaining trees will be worked on at this meeting. Then the tree will be raffled at the end of the meeting. Come with your questions on what and how you need to do this month.

The September meeting will see all three trees return for the last step in this year's training of the cork barked elm. Many thanks to

March Demonstrator – Marcus Janiel

The March meeting began with the first of three new member orientation presentations by Lindsay Shiba. Lindsay covered the origin, history and meaning of Bonsai with an excellent overview at this session.

As you can see on the left, he also brought in several reference books showing styles and John Naka's famous Techniques book. He went over styles of bonsai and different tools used to care and style the trees.

At the April meeting, Lindsay will discuss wiring and basic care, and conclude with the third orientation in May with pottery selection and basic care of bonsai.

Here is Joe introducing Marcus. On the far left is Marcus' tree and on the right is the demo tree that he worked on at the meeting.



Marcus is a long-time member of Descanso Bonsai Club and was most recently one of the demonstrators at the Bonsai-A-Thon. He was a student of John Naka and Harry Hirao and often went on digs with them.

Marcus brought along one of his trees to show what can be done for make a bonsai from nursery stock. As you can see, from the photo above, at a different angle from the previous picture, there is a lot of dead wood, but only a single branch (where his finger is

pointed). He wanted to see what would happen if he cut off all the branches except for one. He calls it a simple tree. The branches were allowed to grow so they are long. He has had the tree for more than 10 years. He liked the twisted trunk and wanted to explore with the exposed dead wood. His approach to bonsai is unconventional by his admission, but as you can see, it works.

With the demo tree, he first wired then styled and he said, "hopefully it will look like something." Later the tree will be raffled off. The winner should let the tree rest outside for at least a week before putting it in full



sun.

For this demo he brought in a San Jose juniper that he purchased two weeks prior. He didn't do any styling, just cleaned up the dead foliage and general housekeeping. Here is the tree from different angles. He has an idea of where is

the front, but it might change.

To start a bonsai there are a set of rules on what to look for: nebari (roots), branches, front of tree and no pigeon breast (in which the trunk comes toward the viewer and then bends backward away from the viewer). He believes in breaking rules so that the tree will still look like a bonsai. He started wiring using a heavy wire, following the celery theory: when fresh it will snape, if dry it will not. When



fresh it is hydrated so the stem/branch will not snape. Marcus uses 50 grit sandpaper to remove the top layer of bark. Cut and clean the bark to create interest. Dead wood sells the tree, it makes it look old but there is



not enough time at the meeting to do any carving. To compress the branches on the tree is one way to style a tree. To move branches




down, add bends and compression. You can see the amount of effort it takes to reposition a branch, far left. Loosen up the fibers in the branch so the branch can bend and can be brought down. He uses one piece of wire to wire two branches. Bend heavier branches first, roots are treated the same. Goal is for a tree to look like a big tree but in a container. Wire at a 45 degree angle is optimal. Wire using both hands, one hand to tighten and the other to guide. Being philosophic, spend money/care for the trees but

then what to do later? Trees need people, trees need care, pass along to people that care passionately about bonsai.

Remove wire before they cut into the bark. This kind of tree is hardy and can be readily repotted. Remove foliage growing on the bottom of the branch (see above). Marcus uses felt grow bags, ceramic pots are hotter so trees are less likely to have heat damage. Roots hit the edges of the felt bag and stop growing, but this is not the case of a tree growing in a ceramic pot. He uses a ready commercial bonsai mix or 100% scoria. He used to fertilize with pellets and cakes, but now uses Miracle Grow because it is easy. For the future, Marcus would like to do a jin and do some carving on this tree.



Here is the tree front (left) and you can see the wiring that was done. On the right side is the back side of the tree. You can see how he compressed the branches, so they lay closer to the trunk.
