#### October Demonstrator – Tom Vuong

The first thing that Tom said was you need to identify the front. For this tree, the tree needs to be tilted up on one side so that the tree is more vertical (see photo bottom left). Always choose the front first. The tree is a Prostrata juniper. Clear out and shorten branches, wire in the direction of the bend. Do large branches first, then detail wiring. Try to open up the tree so that the interior gets some sun, cut ends to open up the tree to enable back budding for next year's growth. Do this every year. Trim so sunlight can reach the interior, you can reduce branch later. Style first, then graft because the graft location and direction depend on the design. You can graft between now through May. Tom's preference is to graft with Itoigawa on California and Utah juniper and with Kishu on Prostrata. The tree will not be finished today, just setting the style.























After care, put the tree in the sun and fertilize. More fertilizer in the summer. He uses any kind. He creates deadwood all by hand to look more natural. Pictures, far left, show some removal of the bark as a start of the shari. Just cleaning up the bark on the trunk made a big difference in this tree. He carves to increase movement in the tree. He power washes trees to remove insects and to clean the bark. Lime sulfur is applied about 6 months after tissue has dried out. He puts cut paste on the edge and in the middle, lime sulfur is applied. He would graft at the same time next year if it

was his tree. You can compare the pictures of the trunk before and after cleaning up the bark, to see how much more interesting the trunk has become.





This tree was not raffled. It will be kept and put up for auction at our Winter Silhouettes show in January.

#### November Demonstrator – CBS Seth Nelson



Seth recently earned his Bonsai Professional certification after nearly six years of apprenticeship at Aichi-en Bonsai in Nagoya, Japan. His approach to bonsai is rooted in a deep respect for the trees' health and longevity. He will not work on a tree in a way that jeopardizes its well-being, he sees this work as not having meaning. Seth was mentored by Jim Van Landingham, a specialist in tropical species, and was later accepted into an apprenticeship under Tanaka-San's guidance at Aichi-en.

During his apprenticeship, Seth honed his skills in traditional techniques while developing a keen understanding of bonsai design, focusing on balancing the strength of the trunk's flow with natural branch structures. He emphasizes minimal wiring to allow the tree's growth to evolve organically. This philosophy promotes refinement

through subtle, less invasive techniques, ensuring long-term health and gradual evolution of the tree. His experiences have inspired him to pursue being an educator, where he aims to contribute to the growth of bonsai culture in the U.S. by working with hobbyists and collectors and sharing his knowledge
